- Use ethical, legal and humanitarian principles in research.
- Use scientific language, orally and in writing.
- Identify the social determinants of health and their influence on health care.
- Identify researchable health needs and problems.
- Identify the methodological phases in social intervention.
- Understand and promote community participation in health care operations.
- Understanding learning processes in training and health education.
- Analyse social and health initiatives for the improvement of quality of life and social welfare.
- Recognize lines of research in the face of emerging demands for care.
