Part B. CV SUMMARY

Professor of Economics (U. of Alcalá) since September 2020 and Associate Professor at Department of Economics for eight years (2012-2019). Associate Professor at U. of Vigo for nine years (2003-2012). Ph.D. in Economics at the European University Institute (Florence, Italy) in 1998. I have 3 times 6-years positive research evaluations (1997-2003,2004-2009,2010-2015) and one 6-year positive evaluation for research transfer activities (2006-2018). Senior Researcher at Spanish Institute for Fiscal Studies (2008-2012).

My main research spans from the general theory and measurement of well-being to the statics and dynamics of the income distribution, poverty, inequality, economic insecurity, the

intergenerational transmission of opportunities, gender discrimination and the effectiveness of public policies on social cohesion using microsimulation techniques. In income dynamics, I have intensely worked on measuring poverty incorporating its time dimension proposing new indices and providing new empirical evidence linked to them to identify chronic versus transitory (but recurrent) poverty. I have analysed the role of duration in determining entries to or exits from poverty considering long income trajectories, made a methodological proposal to measure income mobility using well-known poverty indices to identify upward and downward mobility incidence and intensity for different groups and proposed the use of the counting approach to study economic insecurity including subjective and objective dimensions.

Regarding inequalities in the labour market I have contributed with a relevant methodological proposal for the measurement of wage discrimination incorporating distributive issues which I then used to estimate the impact of discrimination on poverty levels in different groups and countries. I have also proposed other distributive measures to study other forms of deprivation (underemployment). I am author of various empirical studies studying the link between poverty incidence and the economic cycle, the role of social origin in job quality levels and the relevance of the labour market situation of other household members in youth emancipation and I have recently worked on fiscal and transfer policies evaluation using microsimulation techniques (EUROMOD) producing various empirical papers on the efficacy and effectiveness of transfers in reducing child poverty.

I have visited various international research centers along my research career: STICERD (LSE, UK), University of Oxford (UK), ISER (U. Essex, UK) & LISER (Luxembourg). I have presented research results in more than 40 international congresses. I have participated in 6 coordinated national competitive projects since 2004 within the EQUALITAS network (www.equalitas.es), and in two previous ones in 1998 & 2001 headed by UAB researchers. Since 2004 I have been PI and General coordinator of two of these projects (2007-2010) and the current one (2020-2022). I have also participated as PI or researcher in more than 10 other projects or contracts (University of Essex, Observatorio Social de la Fundación La Caixa, UNICEF, FOESSA-Caritas, Instituto de Estudios Fiscales, etc.). I have been part of the network SIMBIEN headed by the U. de Barcelona and PI of a large regional (Comunidad de Madrid) Project on “Inequality, Poverty and Equality of Opportunity”, together with UCM & URJC researchers (2016-2019). I have been PI of the U. of Alcalá in a European Project within the APCIN call (2016-2019) on redistribution and age cohorts titled “CIRCLE-Care and Income Redistributive Cycles in the Lives of Europeans”. The leader was Collegio Carlo Alberto Turin and U. of Antwerp (Belgium) was the third partner.
